Keys

I'm not sure why people collect keys....the variety is interesting...but...? Perhaps it's due to some special interest in or attachment to keys in some way. Keys *do* have an interesting history.

Locks go way back (Polyphemus 'locked' his cave by rolling a stone over the entrance), and Homer (also in the Odyssey) says that Penelope wishing to open a storeroom picked up a well made copper key which had an ivory handle. Locks and keys are mentioned in the Old Testament, and the Ancient Egyptians, Greeks, and Romans all had their own versions.
