This one's a nice old World War II era Safety Set. There are six front-strike Universal 20s covers. The back panels are all the same; each front panel has a different safety hint:

- 1. Use your head-Save your hands!
- 2. Protect your feet-Wear safety shoes
- 3. Carelessness causes many serious accidents
- 4. Check Carefully! Before starting machinery!
- 5. Consideration of fellow employees will..
- 6. Protect your eyes –Wear your goggles

Such safety sets were fairly common during the war, when industry was in high gear
