

Was The Alamo Really The End of The Line For Davy Crockett?

Is nothing sacred?!! We all *know* that Davy Crockett went down fighting at the end of the 13-day siege of the Alamo, wielding his rifle like a club before he fell near the front doors of the former mission's chapel on March 6, 1836.
