*For those who bagged matches before throwing them in the garbage, 'bagging' included putting them in plastic bags, zip-lock bags, and bowls.

*'Soaking' matches included wrapping them in paper towels before putting in garbage.

*'Burning outside' included using burn barrels and camp fires.

*'Burning in the fireplace also included using the match heads for kindling

problems, but, personally, I'd be scared to do that...based on personal experience. Once I just casually dumped quite a few stripped matches into my garbage can in the garage and the whole thing ignited like a jet engine while I was still pouring the matches in!...Last time I did *that*! Now, I soak them in a large bowl in the sink before I dump them into the garbage. If I happen to be stripping in the winter (*matches*, Ladies!), I'll use them in the fireplace, but if it's any other time of the year, I'm wary of keeping all those stripped matches around the house, so I'll use the soaking method.
