

## "Do you put covers back to back in plastic pages?"

Yes: 73 Comments:

No: 24 -Yes, if nothing is on the inside of the cover

-Yes, with blank inserts between them.

Both: 25 -Usually.....But not Railroads and other categories that have vital information on inside.

-Yes, plastic pages cost too much to use only one side!

Don't use: 4 -If they are old covers with nothing on the inside I do.

-Depends, I put covers back to back if there is nothing on the inside that I want to show.

-I do both single and back to back. It depends on amount of matches, quality and pages on hand.

- -I find plastic pages expensive and I use them only for special covers ie: Worlds Fairs, or Railroads with schedules on the other side.
- -No, but only because space is not an issue for me. I'm just getting started in the hobby and covers are so hard to come by. At this rate I could go single cover for years and years!!
- -Full books don't work very well that way. Both sides often contribute to your enjoyment of collecting a full book.
