Colgates are one of the hobby's most sought-after categories. They originated from William Homer Colgate, a Diamond employee who became responsible for the famed Diamond Group I designs. Almost all are from the mid-1930's. There were some 2100 covers listed as of 1995, all sets, I believe, and some quite large. They include incredible Sports sets, VIP sets, Bridge sets, Radio & TV sets, and more. They are some of the gems of the hobby!

There is a large listing of these covers, known as the T & T listing, or Group I listing.
